Bruny Island Community Association April 2008 Meeting



21 people including Councillor Grace attended the April BICA meeting at the Barnes Bay CWA Hall and nearly as many sent apologies and we had no problems eating their share of sausages after the meeting. The Red Cross transport 3 month trial to assess the need and usage of a community vehicle is expected to commence in late May and residents will be sent a letter with the details of how it will operate and how to access the transport when it is required. 25 people have volunteered to be drivers. More volunteers have joined the Bruny News Team and more would be welcome and for those who prefer dirty hands type of volunteering there are tree planting opportunities coming up in the winter. What would we do without volunteers!

No news yet about the future of the airstrip but concern was expressed that it must remain available to the public if it is leased or sold to a private party.

The organizers of the Community Easter Woodchop Carnival were congratulated on a fantastic event which has very quickly become a Bruny Easter tradition attracting a huge crowd of all ages.

The increasing need for a proper dump point for motorhome and caravan toilets was again raised as dumping is happening in bush sites and in Parks toilets which do not cope with either the volume or the chemicals involved. BIAG have it on their agenda along with transport and ferry issues. Public and hall toilets were due for discussions at a BIAG workshop this month prior to Kingborough budget being finalised, so maybe we may see some improvements this year. The Parks toilet at the Lighthouse is often not functional due to water supply issues. The meeting resolved to write to the Minister regarding the urgent need to upgrade the toilet and other facilities to cope with increasing visitor numbers. The upgrade should include some interpretation signage at this iconic spot.. Meanwhile Bernard reported work was proceeding on Lighthouse Rd, upgrading the track to Mabel Bay, removal of some dangerous trees at the Neck and some low intensity burns for fire protection. Parks will be resuming their cat trapping program after the Anzac Day weekend and it is expected that the Cat Control Program will also be resumed while some funding remains.

It was reported that the Boat Club with the assistance of visiting divers had managed to pull 2,000 sea stars the day before the meeting and work was continuing that day. Well done on an amazing effort.

The Historical Society reported on their Open Day at Variety Day and advised of working bees the week of 3 to 10 May at the History Room. Anyone available to assist with this fascinating collection of Island history is welcome.

Bruny Community Forestry Group reported that John Davis is the new chairman and Shaun Bromfield and Christa Wernick have joined the Group. Forestry Tasmania will be briefing the community about the draft plan for harvesting on Bruny over the next 3 years with the opportunity for questions and feedback at a meeting in the Adventure Bay Hall at 10.30 am on Saturday May 10. This will be followed by a car tour for anyone interested.

Lunawanna Hall now has a barbeque provided by BICA as a thank you for providing the hall rent free for meetings Questions were asked about the future operators of the ferry following runnours of a change and notification that bulk tickets would only be valid until June 30 but no information was available. We'll just have to wait and see. We were however informed by Councillor Grace that the new Manager for the Kingborough Council is Paul West, previously Manager of Wynyard Warratah Council, due to start on June 16. Hopefully we'll see him inspecting his largest area of responsibility soon after that date

MESSAGE FROM CR. DAVID GRACE, KINGBOROUGH COUNCIL

NEW GENERAL MANAGER

Kingborough Council appoints new General Manager Mr Paul West from the Waratah-Wynyard Council. In an article in The Advocate it states that Council Manager leaves the municipality in good shape. Mr West will commence duties on June 16th, 2008. He states it's a new challenge. Mr West said, "I'm sad about leaving Wynyard but it is time for a change, I think with the challenges in front of Kingborough I can add some value."

The mayor of Waratah-Wynyard, Kevin Hyland, has said Mr West has injected significant improvements to the council's financial position and processes of Local Government during Mr West's stint.

Time again for Estimates and Capital Works 2008-2009.

I would like to remind residents about the setting of rates as the Bruny Island Advisory Group and also the Bruny Island Community Association requested council to look at rating alternatives under section 107 of the local Government Act 1993. This act enables a council, by absolute majority, to vary a rate according to a number of factors including land use and locality.

I would like to bring to your attention an article on page 4 in the Cygnet and Channel Classifieds dated 10th April 2006.

Assistance to Farmers - by Mayor Graham Bury

Mayor Bury has stated that Council agreed to limit the inevitable increase and provided a 50% remission in rates for bona fide producers as a one year offer.

Is Mayor Bury going to work with Councillors to achieve the same offer for 2008/2009??

FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR THE PERIOD 1ST JULY 2007 TO 1ST MARCH 2008.

Rating income is \$500,000 above the year to date which is due to supplementary Rates Processing. Also development fees and charges in the Planning, Building and Plumbing area are all above budget by \$80,000. Rating certificates are above budget by almost \$100,000. Capital Works and Public Open Space contributions are also above budget by a combined total of over \$340,000. We are now 75% of the way through the Financial Year and to date 34% of the 14.7 Million Capital Works Programme has been spent or committed. Also revenue interest from investments is still \$65,000 above budget at this time.

Determining Rates - A Sensitive Balancing Act- Quoted by Michael Gaffney

President of the Local Government Association of Tasmania. LGAT March 2008 Newsletter

."All Councils would be well under way with the 2008-2009 budget process. As elected leaders of municipalities, we are charged with the responsibility of attaching a "dollar figure" to the services required to meet the identified needs of the community. This process is made somewhat easier when councils have adequate and appropriate forward planning documents, reports, policies and guidelines to assess and guide decisions."

As of to date Council have not yet had a workshop or any information regarding the 2008/2009 Budget.

On a very personal note I would like to thank the Bruny Island Community Association and Bruny Island in general for their thoughts, prayers and kind expressions of sympathy for my family and me on the sad loss of my son-in-law.

What's going on at the Health Centre? Welcome to our new nursing staff members—Sue Orsmond, Joanne Lees, Catherine Perez and Kimmy Brooks. Some regular staff are taking leave over the Winter—so you may not see them again until Spring. Jen Levett has resigned and has commenced a 3 year paramedic course at Tas Ambulance—good luck Jen! Annette Wiggins is now working mostly at the Royal Hobart Hospital but will work on occasions at the Centre. Lynette Holland is currently Acting ADON whilst Janice Kaden is taking some long service leave.

At the end of last year the Centre undertook a Clinical Audit Review as part of a statewide audit of all Primary Health Centres. As a result, there are lots of changes happening at the Centre—all positive and for the greater benefit of the community. Staff are currently working hard to implement these changes.

All up 16 students competed in 46 events!!



Bruny Community Forest Group Meeting 26th March 2008 2.30pm

at Bruny House

John Davis appointed as the Chair of the group and that Jenny Boyer fill the roll as the Contact person / Co-Ordinator for the group. Peter Pepper would continue as the secretary and industry Co-Ordinator for the group. The new members of the group, (Shaun Bromfield and Christa Wernick) were welcomed to the group.

General Business:

- Harvesting Update ref SB012B and SB038A: Amy Robertson gave an update to the meeting. There has been no change to the widely circulated schedule with following with approximate time lines.
- Cowen Bros. would commence road lines (650 metres) clearing after the end of March as agreed on
- Once the road lines were completed (approximately one month) they would then moved to complete the harvesting of SB038A, which would take approximately three months.
- Then the contractors would move back to SB012B to complete the harvesting of the first section of 15 hectares, which again would take approximately three months).
- 2. Three Year Plan: The draft Three Year Plan for Bruny Island State Forests was on schedule and should be ready for the group to view / comment on by mid to late April. Action: BCF group to meet to review Bruny Island State Forests draft plan late April
- 3. The Swift Parrot: Forestry Tasmania were waiting on the Threatened Species Unit (TSU), working group to finalise the "New Prescriptions" for the protection of swift parrot habitat. In the meantime habitat will be assessed by the TSU and protect where necessary in the interim.
- Group Membership: The group resolved to invite additional members of the Bruny community to join the group for a short or long term presents on the group.
- Wild Fire effects on State Forests: Both Mike Farrow (Huon District Forest Manager) and Amy Robertson (Huon District Planner) indicated that the surveys that had been conducted were indicating that the resource was recovering and that the area where reseeding had occurred were being monitored.
- Water Sampling of Captain Cook and Marvista Creeks: resolved to continue the monitoring of Captain Cook Creek at least until the Harvesting of SB038A had been. It was also resolved that water sampling was not needed for the Marvista Creek as the take off point as the roading is on a different side of the hill to Marvista Creek. It was however resolved to keep a watching brief on Marvista during the Harvesting operation. It was discussed that the coupe boundary and the topography did not indicate that run off form the harvesting operation would affect Marvista Creek.
- Review of the "Community Agreement". Background: There is in existence an "Agreement between the Bruny Island Community Association (BICA) and the Forest Industry", which is in need of a review. The previous agreement was last considered prior to 2001 and probably as far back as 1993?. resolved to gather details of past agreements between the Bruny Community and the Forest Industry and progress to a revised formal document during 2008.
 - Alternative Transport Route for SB012C: Christa Wernick raised the issue of the alternative transport route, Wooreddy and Resolution roads. This has not been resolved.
- 8. Lockleys Road Signage: Following comments by John Davis on the issue of safety of buses and campervans using Lockleys Cuthberts Link Roads. It was resolved that signage be ordered and erected by Forestry Tasmania at the intersection of Resolution and Lockleys roads and the commencement of Cuthberts Roads, indicating that the road was unsuitable for private traffic particularly "Buses and
- Public Forum: The members of group discussed holding a public forum to assist in the disbursement of information to the Bruny Community including non-permanent residents. It was resolved that the Three Year Plan for Bruny (2008-2009-2010) would be a good stating point for a public forum. The following actions were resolved following discussions.
 - That a public Forum be held on Saturday the 10th of May 2008 at the Adventure Bay Hall commencing at 10.30am.
 - The subject of the Forum would be the presentation of the Three Year Plan (2008-2009-2010) for the State forests on Bruny Island.
 - That a tour (using private cars) of the proposed operations would follow at approximately 11.30am.
 - That notification to the community of the Forum be through the following avenues.
 - 1. Bruny Island News, Copy to Bruny News by 20th of April.
 - Advertised in both shops at Lunawanna and Adventure Bay.
 - E-mail lists with attached notices.
 - The Adventure Bay Hall is to be booked by Forestry Tasmania.

Timalayan Spiti Dental Program

n April 2006 Dr. Bob Lavis had the honor of meeting the Abbot of Tabo Ancient Monastery Geshe Sonam Wangdui on his visit to Tasmania. During the Abbot's visit he asked Dr. Lavis why not come to Tabo School and assist with the dental treatment for Tabo's 400 school children? Dr. Lavis replied "I did not know, why not", and from this point Dr. Lavis became interested in the possibility of assisting in a dental project in the Spiti Valley, Himachel Pradesh, India. To gain experience Dr. Lavis participated in the April 2007 Australian Tibetan Dental Program for 3 weeks. This was based at the Delek Hospital in Dharamsala and have him a greater insight into the dental needs of the Tibetan school children. This program has been operating for nearly 20 years, but does not service Spiti.

The Spiti Valley lies along India's northern boarder with Tibet in the state of Himachel Pradesh. It is a remote, high altitude cold desert region of sheer cliffs and barren

slopes. Spiti, known as the "Valley of Monasteries" forms one of the Trans-Himalayan frontier regions of north-west India. The Spiti Valley has a population of approx. 10,000 in an area of 8,000sq. km. Spitians are Indian by birth and nationality, but

their language is Bhoti (a dialect of Tibet) and their culture is Tibetan Buddhist.

Spiti is cut off most of the year by great mountain barriers and by a long winter. Furthermore, the power supply and communication with the outside world regularly fail to function reliably. Unfortunately, accessibility to the outside world is only possible in fair weather conditions during summer. For the rest of the year it remains isolated as the roads in this region are disrupted due to the thick layer of snow.

In 2006 a Dutch medical team from "Medical Checks for Children" examined and treated 460 children at

Munsel-Ling school at Rangrik. The greatest occurring illness was dental disease caused by diet and the level of dental care/eduction. There is no Spiti dental progam available to the community and the nearest available treatment is a days trip by bus each way.

Both the School Principle of Rangrik and the Abbot of Tabo training of local dental therapists on use and maintenance of dental equipment.

Both Rangrik and Tabo schools have grown since their inception and students numbers are approx 400 at each school. Eighty percent of the students are boarders and are cared for by house parents. Each school is an



encouraged assistance in the establishment of a dental program/ clinic for their schools and the Spiti Valley.

As a result, Dr. Bob Lavis is establishing the Himalyan Spiti Dental Program which is sending an Australian dental team to Spiti once a year for approximately 3 years during summer for 2 to 4 weeks. The programs goals are to:

- install and set up a basic dental clinic between the two schools,
- treat and manage dental disease,
- establish a dental education program working with teachers, house-parents and health care workers to encourage tooth brushing, fluoride toothpaste use and dietary changes, and

English standard school that also teaches Hindi and Bhoti. The schools provide and ideal opportunity to initiate a dental program commencing with children and if successful, statistical results would be evident in a matter of 2-3 years. With success and local involvement, the program could spread to the greater community. This approach has been endorsed by the Administrator of Delek Hospital (Dharamsala). The Australian team are self funded but monetary contributions and equipment are required if the program is to succeed.

Cheques payable to: Dr. Bob Lavis/Spiti Program 150 Collins St Hobart TAS 7000 Barely remembered childhood excursions did not prepare me for the unspoiled beauty and grandeur of Bruny Island. The isthmus seemed narrower but the bays just as wide and sweeping, the cliffs just as steep. So much of the island held no familiarity: at times, it could just as well have been my first visit. But then, suddenly and unexpectedly, a vista would open a door – creakily - to my past.

Being a Tasmanian who now lives in inland country Queensland, I was drawn to the ocean like iron shavings to a magnet. The long sandy stretches and the gentle lapping of waves proved a perfect antidote to the nine-to-five grind. What surprised me more than anything was the island's ability to escape the tourism scars that mar so many other destinations touted as 'pristine and unspoiled'. I determined immediately to follow the example set by so many who had come before me; to leave not even a faint outline of an ecological footprint. I hope I succeeded.

With so much promising water surrounding me, fishing seemed to be a natural part of the holiday agenda. I dipped a line in off the jetty but my standard fishing modus operandi netted a big fat zero. I fared no better casting from the rocks. Once I took some local advice however, and changed to a suitable jig, the squid almost caused a riot in their haste to paint me with their inky abstracts. Numerous recipe books were called into service as I searched for the perfect method for cooking squid, with the best dish I tried being salt and pepper barbequed squid (garnered from a hodgepodge of recipes):

Flatten out the squid and score with a criss-cross pattern. Then cut into rough squares (about 3x3cm). Mix some cornflour with heaps of seasalt and freshly ground black pepper (some ground chilli can be added for extra heat). Dip squid pieces into a good-quality plain mayonnaise and then roll the pieces through the cornflour mixture. Throw the squid onto a piping hot barbie, flick it all about a bit with the spatula for no more than a couple of minutes and serve immediately with lemon wedges. Perfectly accompanied by a glass of Tasmanian Riesling or an icy cold beer.

Of course, there's more to a holiday on Bruny than fishing and eating. When in Rome, as the saying goes ... yes, bushwalking on the island is a 'must-do'. There were so many great walks but, for me, nothing could beat Fluted Cape. Following the more gradual inland ascent, the sudden view as I reached the summit was heart-stopping. Then, as I began my descent via the coastal cliff track, a sea eagle graced me with an acrobatic dive before continuing its soaring journey. Perfection.

Those who call the Island home know how to put out the welcome mat and could show the rest of us a thing or two about ecological preservation and maintenance.

On the ferry back, I glimpsed a face from more than thirty years ago; a face that had weathered in a far more kindly fashion than my own. Her lines seemed to be the result of gentle smiles and quiet contemplation where my own face showed evidence of more frowns than laughter. I hesitated, wondering if I should revisit my youth and impose myself upon her solitude. Then, I remembered my silent promise to step lightly; to leave a gentle imprint. I wanted to leave Bruny unaffected and untouched by my visit so I turned my face back to the sea.

POTATO BAKE

SERVES: 8

From SYMPLY TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE 3 ©

1 kilo potatoes peeled cooking spray

1 cup 25% reduced-fat grated tasty cheese 4 tablespoons grated parmesan cheese 1½ cups skim milk

2 x 30g sachets 4 cheese sauce (Continental®)

Preheat oven 200°C fan forced.

Peel potatoes and slice thinly. Place ½ the potato slices in a lasagne dish that has been coated with cooking spray. Sprinkle ½ the grated cheese and ½ the parmesan cheese over potatoes, top with remaining potatoes.

In a small saucepan bring milk to boil, add sauce sachets and whisk together. Pour over potato. Now sprinkle over the remaining parmesan cheese and grated cheese. Cover with foil (spray foil with cooking spray to avoid food sticking).

Bake for 1 hour, remove foil and cook a further 10-15 minutes or until potato is cooked.

Part 2 of 5 by John Davis, who, as a former lighthouse keeper, made 8 trips to Tasman between 1967 and 1974.


Accommodation at Tasman was provided in 3 brick houses. No 1 quarters for the Head Lighthouse Keeper and his family contained 13 rooms and it was 150 yards downhill from the tower towards the haulage-way. The other houses occupied by the assistant keepers and their families were more modest 3 bedroom dwellings and these were close to the base of the tower. This area also contained a fuel storage shed for 44 gallon drums of Kerosene, Diesel, Petrol and oil. A radio room and a generator shed with 2 single cylinder Lister generators and a battery bank provided 110Volt DC power for the island.

The generator was only powered up one day per week for the mother to do the family wash, too bad if it was blowing a gale. New sheets were often frayed badly before they even had a chance to dry.

As the station was a watch station the days were split into 6 x 4 hr watches so that someone was on duty 24 hrs per day 7 days per week 365 days per year. Vigilance was of supreme importance. During the daytime watch, maintenance of the station was carried out – painting, fuel cartage, lens cleaning, battery, generator, haulage and flying fox maintenance.

The night watch consisted of continual occupation of the lantern room to ensure the pressure was kept up to the lamp and the clockwork was kept wound every hour.

In the words of the official manual the keeper was to "cast an eye seawards every hour" and record any passing ships or unusual occurrence.

- Prepare the children. Take a few minutes to wash the children's hands and faces (if they are small), comb their hair and, if necessary, change their clothes. They are little treasures and he would like to see them playing the part. Minimise all noise. At the time of his arrival, climinate all noise of the washer, dryer or vacuum. Try to encourage the children to be quiet.
- Be happy to see him.
- Greet him with a warm smile and show sincerity in your desire to please him.
- Listen to him. You may have a dozen important things to tell him, but the
 moment of his arrival is not the time. Let him talk first remember, his
 topics of conversation are more important than yours.
- Make the evening his. Never complain if he comes home late or goes out to dinner, or other places of entertainment without you. Instead, try to understand his world of strain and pressure and his very real need to be at home and relax.
- Your goal: Try to make sure your home is a place of peace, order and tranquillity where your husband can renew himself in body and spirit.
- . Don't greet him with complaints and problems.
- Don't complain if he's late home for dinner or even if he stays out all night.
 Count this as minor compared to what he might have gone through that day.
- Make him comfortable. Have him lean back in a comfortable chair or have him lie down in the bedroom. Have a cool or warm drink ready for him.
- Arrange his pillow and offer to take off his shoes. Speak in a low, soothing and pleasant voice.
- Pon't ask him questions about his actions or question his judgment or integrity. Remember, he is the master of the house and as such will always exercise his will with fairness and truthfulness. You have no right to question him.
